

PANDEMIC POLICY AREAS	CENTRAL RESPONSE	DEVOLVED RESPONSE
Personal health	Public system takes responsibility for control of infection.	Private responsibility
Testing for infection	Compulsory testing near outbreaks	Individuals volunteer to be tested
Vulnerable old and sick	Regulations compel potential carriers to stay at distance	Individuals volunteer to isolate and shut out risks.
Gatherings	Regulated limits on gatherings, space and social distances.	Voluntary limits.
Employment	Attendance at work regulated.	Individuals can volunteer to go to work or stay home.
Education	Schools closed	Some students and teachers volunteer to attend school.
Travel	Borders closed and services stopped.	Borders open and services volunteered by air, rail. bus companies
Quarantine	Mandatory for entering or leaving prescribed territories.	Self-quarantine voluntary at travellers' risk. Individuals who are fearful of infection during travel can stay home.
Wearing face masks	Compulsory with symptoms.	Voluntary and with symptoms stay home.
Restaurants	Regulated occupation of space.	Voluntary occupation of space.
Super-spreaders	Penalised if caught running amok with symptoms.	Individuals fearful of infection in public places can stay home.
Tracking	Authorities attempt to trace infections to source.	Infected individuals are isolated and treated.
